PROPOSED BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

**ARTICLE VII The Standing Committees** 

Amendment: Section 2: The Director of the Ansonia Nature and Recreation Center or designee will be a member of all standing committees.

Amendment: Section 3: A programming committee will be appointed whose duties will be to plan, host and arrange for public educational programs and annual events.

Amendment: Section 4: A publicity and information committee will be appointed whose responsibilities will include issuing press releases, preparing articles for publication, distribution of posters and flyers, and maintaining a press book

Amendment: Section 5: A service committee will be appointed whose duties will include coordination of volunteer services.

Amendment: Section 6: A membership committee will be appointed whose duties will be to keep updated files and current lists of all FANCI members, donors and mailing lists.

Amendment: Section 7: A committee will be appointed to stock merchandise and maintain the Nature Shop located at the Ansonia Nature and Recreation Center.

ADD: Section 8: A Redwing Pond House Committee will be appointed to include the Director/Head Teacher of the Redwing Pond House naturebased preschool who will meet monthly prior to the FANCI executive board meeting. Responsibilities will include oversight of the pre-school finances and staff and to aid the Redwing Pond House staff in carrying out the program's goals and objectives.
