

Garden Rules and Agreement

Plot management:

- Each plot gardener is responsible for having something planted in their plot by JUNE 1st 2014.
- Each plot gardener is responsible for maintaining and upkeep of their garden plot. Watering, weeding, harvesting and any other garden related maintenance are all the responsibility of the gardener. Gardeners may arrange for other gardeners to water their plots.
- Each plot gardener is responsible for the upkeep of the aisle abutting their plot. The aisle must be weeded and well-maintained, including placing woodchips on the aisle when provided.
- It the plot gardener's responsibility to notify the garden committee members if he/she is not able to care for their plot(s).
- Plot gardener may harvest vegetables and flowers from their garden only, unless given permission by another plot user to do so. Crops that grow beyond plot boundaries maybe picked by the holder of the plot they are growing into, or may be cut at the plot boundary.
- Tall crops such as sunflowers or corn may only be planted where they will not shade neighboring plots.
- Dispose of weeds and plant materials in designated compost areas only or within a compost pile placed in the center of the plot.
- At the end of the growing season, gardeners are responsible for clearing their plot of all plant material and leaving the plot as they found it in the spring. Pulled vegetation may be composted in the center of the plot.
- Each plot gardener is expected to participate by volunteer (5) five hours during the season at scheduled work parties.
- All plots will be inspected (3) three times throughout the growing season. Plot tenders that have not started planting by June 1st , are weedy, or do not meet the guidelines will be notified. Failure to respond within (10) ten days will result in forfeiture of the plot and may result in a loss of future gardening privileges.
- Plots have been marked for the reason of individual plot recognition. Please do not move the markers.
- The bulletin board is for garden business only. Feel free to give notes on the bulletin board for any useful hints and ideas, but please no soliciting.
